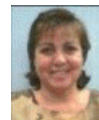

The Conference will coincide with a social programme organised by civil society which will mark this Conference as a truly multi-sectoral platform for the prioritisation of a global injury prevention and safety promotion agenda. The launch of the outreach programme will coincide with the annual symbolic **Salt March** which commemorates Mahatma Gandhi's 1930, 24-day march for full Indian independence through non-violent means. Organised by the granddaughter of the Mahatma, **Ela Gandhi**, the march will begin in the settlement of Phoenix to the North of the Durban city centre and end on the city's beachfront. This re-enactment of the historical march will represent ongoing commitment to non-violence and securing human rights through peace promotion.

The Conference will also provide the platform for the launch of an annual lecture series dedicated to the legacy of the late, Advocate Abdullah Omar, the former South African Justice and Transport Minister and champion for equality, social justice and human rights. The inaugural **Dullah Omar Memorial lecture** will be delivered by **Justice Pius Langa**, the Chief Justice of the constitutional court of South Africa.
